Podcast Worksheet Are You a Hot Mess? Get Healing (Joseph's Story)

Scriptural Texts:

Genesis 45:1-15; 50:20

Main Points:

- 1. Time does not heal wounds. When the right circumstances come together, unhealed wounds are quickly fanned into full flame.
- 2. Our wounds may have gone dormant, but if they are not fully healed, they will continue to emit toxic waste.
- 3. Painful wounds make it hard to hear to God's voice.
- 4. Unhealed wounds make us desperate to maintain control, usurping God's place in our life as our true power, protector, and provider.
- 5. When we maintain control of our wounds we are not protecting them, we are preserving them.
- 6. Our season of healing is always confusing, messy, and uncomfortable.
- 7. God can't heal us until we relinquish control to him and allow him to do the needed work.
- 8. Just as God restored Benjamin to his big brother, Joseph, so God gives us the desires of our heart when we allow him to heal us.
- 9. When Joseph's healing was completed, he could see how God had been working toward a good purpose in his life all along.

Questions:

- 1. What are some of the wounds you have received in your life? How have these wounds interfered with your ability to see and hear God?
- 2. If friends, family, and coworkers were interviewed about you, how would they describe you? A controlling, manipulative, messy person? A kind, gracious, accepting person?
- 3. To what degree have you allowed God to do a healing work in your life? Are there unresolved issues that still need God's healing? Are there wounds you are still holding on to? If so, describe.

Prayer of Response:

Lord God, I realize there are still some wounds and rough edges needing your attention. I don't want to be a messy person, hurting people wherever I go. Forgive me for guarding these things rather than giving them to you. Please come and begin the necessary work in my life so I can get free from anything holding me back. I choose to trust you.
