Podcast Worksheet Victim Identity Part 1: You are Good Stuff

Scriptural Texts:

2 Samuel 13; Psalms 119:73; 139:14-15; Jeremiah 2:21; 1 Timothy 4:4; Philippians 4:13

Main Points:

- 1. Being victimized means something painful happened because of someone else's actions.
- 2. While painful issues will always be part of our story, they do not have to be part of our identity.
- 3. A victim is someone who chooses to define themselves by the choices they have made, and by the things that have happened to them.
- 4. What we are and what has happened to us are two different things; they aren't connected.
- 5. We can allow our failures and shortcomings to become part of our false our identity, too.
- 6. Our true identity is something that never changes because it comes from God.
- 7. God created us and designed our basic package to be perfect for the life for which he's made us.
- 8. Everyone is an excellent work of God's hands. We all have full value; there are no 'seconds.'
- 9. Reversing the habit of tearing ourselves down is a battle worth fighting.
- 10. Satan loves lying to us about our worth and value, encouraging us to be victims.
- 11. God says we are choice vines, seeds of the highest quality! He says we are good stuff!
- 12. Trying to find our significance in viewing ourselves as victims reaps a pitiful payoff.
- 13. Victims prefer to hang onto their wounds rather than get healing; they want people to feel sorry for them.
- 14. Victims blame others rather than take responsibility for their choices.
- 15. Self-pity is poison to the abundant life.
